Remarks on Beaul Boat, Bertha of New Bedford
 Civil Time - - Tuesday Jun. 15th 1878
 This Day Commences with a fine breeze from N W
 with good weather at 3 O'clock A M the Tug-Boat
 took us from the Wharf in New Bedford and I went
 out to Sea with the Pilot on Beaul at 4th Post-
 10 noon the Pilot left us the Wind from N W
 Steering S E W at 1 P M we kept off Steering S E by E
 with a fair breeze ^{we} stowed the Riggers & Chimes and
 made all snug for the Night. So Ends this Day one Steaming
 run out - Richard Reed

Wednesday Jun. 16th

This Day Commences with a strong breeze from N W
 Steering S by E took in the Top Sheet & Lower Main
 Sail and Tack and Double reefed the Top Sails at 4 A M
 ran a Sail at 1 P M Steering E by S with a gale of
 Snow at 1 P M Steering E S E So Ends the Day

Thursday Jun. 17th

This Day Commences with a fine breeze from N W Steering
 E S E at 5 A M moderate trade with fair employment
 in fitting the Boat for Whaling. Left 27-11 N

Friday Jun. 18th Breeze 26-20 W

This Day Commences with a light breeze from N Steering by
 the wind to the Eastward. Employed in fitting Boat at
 at 4 O'clock P M a strong breeze from N E Steering
 S E by E under close reefed Top Sail even at
 Courses Lau & Sail to the Westward one attempted
 to Day
