

Remarks Made On Board Bark Yeoman

Saturday Oct 7th 1845

Begins with strong breeze from Northward heading N by E by S under start kept topsails and Reeft Tackled at 1 Pm set the 1<sup>st</sup> Main sail reefed same & Ship striking at 6 Pm no opening the main yard middle part more moderate let the reef out of the courses and one reef out of the fore topsail better part unrolled getting a new strain of topsail yard at 7 more or less this day

Long 65 57

Sunday Oct 8th

Begins with moderate breeze from N heading N by W at 1 Pm went up the main topsail yard and made all sail middle part at 4 Pm the wind backed to N by W at 6 Pm took the ship to N by W better part the same at 7 6 Pm when we tried for soundings but found none so early this day

Long 66 38

Monday Oct 9th

Begins with strong breeze from Westward heading N by W by N on Larboard beam & tried for soundings found sand and gravel 1/2 in 45 fathoms mid part at 5 Pm the wind backed to N by W at 8 Pm took the topgallant sail and set the topsails at 9 took hook in the 1<sup>st</sup> main sail and opened at 11 following hard aloft set the fore topsail under a Ship steering N by W at 12 Pm rounded again for 30 fathoms found sand better more moderate at daylight made sail at 11 begins wind, weather moderating  
Long 67 34

Tuesday Oct 10th

Begins with light breeze from N heading N by W under all sail at 4 Pm fresh breeze from N by W heading N by W middle part strong breeze heading N by W by S took in the deck and Reeft the topsails but part took in the 1<sup>st</sup> main sail and opened a 1/2 spane in company with us at 7 more moderate made sail 10 o'clock this day

Place and date: At Sea - 1843 - 1845

Condition when received: Leather spine rotted. Marbled sides worn. Paper acid, stained and soiled. Covers loose.

Work performed: Disassembled, removed surface dirt from pages and washed in hot water to reduce stains. Decidified paper, mended and guarded as necessary and reserved on five linen tapes. Rebound in 3/4 calfskin with Japanese paper sides under original marbled paper sides. Replaced original end papers.
