Tuesday 1. Bark Bertha sail from the wharf
on a whaling voyage ^{drop anchor} ^{stream} drop anchor
at 10 a.m. hove up and tow out sight
the light ship on a whaling voyage
on Atlantic at 1 p.m. tug C. J. Hart
let go we made sail ^{haul} to sea
the whale sail out strut up and
clear the decks wash off at 5 p.m.
take ship at 7 p.m. test again at 9 p.m.
test again at 3 a.m. test heading S'E.
So ends

Wednesday 2. 1901 these day begins with
light variable winds part of the day
heading ESE. latter part W. SW at
1 a.m. start reapey short sail at at
day light set the whale sail one sail
in sight heading to the eastward, at
ward regain the boats and putter
up the cutting penets so ends

Thursday 3. 1901 these day begins with
Northly wind and rain the whole
day running steer S'E. latter part the
same so ends

Oct

Friday 4 - 1901 these day begins with fresh
northly winds and cloudy running
steer S'E. one steamer in sight at 6 a.m.
heading N'E. working regain the
boats and some other small jobs
so ends

Saturday 5 - 1901 these day begins with
fresh northly winds and clear
weather running steer S'E. the whale
