lately landed from the Schooner Richmond
of Provincetown Mass. Joshua Hutchings master
from Leadens, Pappahannock bound for
Boston, which vessel was stranded on
Princes Neck, on the South side of Rhode-
Island, and about three miles from Newport
R.I., on the morning of the 27th March, last
just respectfully report, that we repaired
on the third Inst. to the place where said
vessel was stranded & found two large lots
of Corn, landed and laying in a field.
