P. M. Steady breeze and fine clear weather  
Wind from South. with all sail set  
Employed clear up the deck passed several

Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup> 1907  
Steady breeze and fine clear weather wind from S.  
and we saw few Sailing vessels and stowage  
Employed unbrut the cables and put them  
below Lat: 40.00 Longitude 69 53. end of day.

Monday the 16<sup>th</sup> 1907 P. M. Steady  
breeze and fine clear weather wind from  
Westward course SE. Employed we has set  
the stowage cutting parit and braka out two  
could see of tow line saw one vessel.  
Lat: 38 55 Longitude 67 45 end of the day

Remarks Tuesday September the 17<sup>th</sup>  
1907 P. M. Fresh breeze and clear weather  
Westerly. Wind course SE Employed straightening  
up the ship. Lat: 38 08 Longitude 65 28

Remarks Wednesday September the 18<sup>th</sup>  
1907 A. M. Strong breeze and heavy rain  
Squall. hauled the stowsail and flying jib  
for gallant sail and mensesail at 3 P. M.  
Wind hauled to the north west and we  
braced forward the yards. course SE to E  
Watch on deck employed repairing Chasing  
gear. and row flying jib halyard & gear tamper  
back. end of the day Lat: 36 28 Longitude 62 20
