

Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> March

244 Commences with strong gales from N<sup>W</sup> at 6 P.M. sent up the main yard set the main topsail close reefed middle part more mod. At 10 P.M. set up reefs ends with pleasant weather Lat 27° 42' Long 64° 48'

Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup>

245 Commences with light breezes from N<sup>W</sup> all sail set heading westward unben, the mizen topsail to repair Lat 28° 35' Long 66° 45'

Thursday 31<sup>st</sup>

246 Begins with light winds from N<sup>W</sup> mid part calm of N wind from the westward tacked to the N<sup>W</sup> to run two sail steering S<sup>E</sup> Lat 29° 05' Long 68° 42'

Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April

247 Commences with light winds from west and pleasant, at 8 wind hauled tacked to N<sup>W</sup> at 8 squally double reefed the topsails mid part light winds made sail latter part pleasant Lat 29° 43' Long 68° 13'

Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup>

248 Light winds from N<sup>E</sup> steering N<sup>W</sup> unben, the fore topsail to repair mid part mod winds from S latter part thick Lat 30° 54' Long 69° 03'

Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup>

249 Commences with strong winds from S at 8 P.M. took in topgallant sails wind shifted to N<sup>W</sup> tacked ship latter part light winds from S Lat 31° 53' Long 69° 14'

Monday 4<sup>th</sup>

250 Begins with light winds from S<sup>W</sup> under foremast saw a sail steering S<sup>E</sup> at 8 P.M. squally reefed the topsails latter part strong winds and thick made sail saw a sail steering S<sup>E</sup> Lat 34° 13' Long 71° 46'

Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>

251 Commences with strong winds from S<sup>W</sup> and thick weather at 8 P.M. took in topgallant sails and double reefed the topsails at 8 close reefed squally with thunder and lightning the wind at 8 furled the topsails latter part heavy gales and thick Lat 36° 23' Long 72° 54'

Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup>

252 Begins with heavy gales from N<sup>W</sup> at 6 P.M. more mod set the fore topsail and mainsail mid part mod made sail latter part heavy gales from N<sup>W</sup> 8 days from Havana latter part squally shortened sail Lat 36° 23' Long 72° 54'

Thursday 8<sup>th</sup>

253 First part light winds from S set topgallant sails and studding sails at 4 P.M. heavy squalls from N<sup>W</sup> took in sail and hove up mid and latter part heavy gales with snow Lat 36° 35' Long 71° 53'

Friday 8<sup>th</sup>

254 Heavy gales from the N<sup>W</sup> and a heavy sea at 6 inclined to madden to set the fore topsail mainsail and gill mid part wind light made sail latter part wind variable sent up topgallant yards Lat 38° 36' Long 70° 48'

Saturday 9<sup>th</sup>

255 First part begins with light winds and variable N<sup>W</sup> wind at 8 P.M. mid part wind fresh at 4 at the further north of the gulf stream kept off N<sup>W</sup> latter part strong winds double reefed the topsails Lat 38° 54' Long 71° 45'

Sunday 10<sup>th</sup>

256 Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> strong winds from S<sup>W</sup> close reefed the topsails at 11 sound 50 fathoms wind increasing to 12 in the fore and mizen topsails at 3 hove to 25 feet at 6 saw the land N<sup>W</sup> 6 miles dist at 8 more took light fore N<sup>W</sup> 11 miles dist at 12 took a fresh fresh winds
