Wednesday 22 July

Strong gales throughout this day from S & W with thick fog first and middle parts lying to heading off shore latter part made sail and stood in there nothing in sight

Thursday 23 July

Light winds from the south with thick fog humbering about here doing nothing no whales seen ships about got soundings in 25 fathoms at 8 h & 10 m powered the waist boat to catch fish found the water to deep at 60 fathoms stood in shore 1 h 30 m and got soundings in 25 fathoms sent the boat once more and got 6 whole but four cod fish and 6 scalpin * came on board at noon and stood away S & E with the wind at south

Friday 24 July

Light winds from south with a thick fog standing to the Eastward plenty of hump backs all round

Saturday 25 July

Light breezes from East to South steering by the wind to the East and South thick fog throughout no whales here

Sunday 26 July

Strong breeze from the West throughout steering to the south nothing in sight whatever

Monday 27 July

Strong gales from the West steering to the south nothing in sight

Tuesday 28 July 1865

Moderate weather with light breeze from the Eastward clear and nothing to be seen whatever steering to the south

Wednesday 29 July

Clear weather with strong breeze from the S & W steering S & E running night and day all over the ocean looking for a ship to get provision opened the last barrel of meat to day we have in the ship nothing to be seen on the ocean Latt Long

Thursday 30 July

Moderate breezes from the S & W foggy weather steering S & E saw one hump back a piece of blubber and some pieces of boat board picked up a large log of pine wood cut it up for fire wood bent a new Buzzen top sail employed repairing sails

Friday 31 July

Blowing fresh gales from S & W to W foggy steering S & E and South saw several pieces of blubber at 9 h & 10 m spoke the Fuscarora Colofrey got two barrels of meat from her

Saturday 1 August

Pleasant weather with moderate breezes from the West at 2 h & 10 m spoke the Isabella New Bedford 15 00 hrs at 8 h am spoke the ship ship. S & E whales five sails in sight snowhale to be seen whatever steering to the East and South Latt Long

Sunday 2 August

Strong breezes from the West steering to the south and East spoke the ship Alfred J. J. got 6 barrels of beef and one cask of bread saw three Caracaps but no whales to be seen our voyage is done entirely
