Friday the 26 of Decemder  
This Day we have it rather squally and the  
fair steering S E by E with hands a doing  
Saw thing Lat 42: 08 Long 43: 33 E

Saterday the 27 of Decemder  
This morning we had a very heavy squall  
and split our mizen top sail and at  
last it and dried it and mended it and  
at 2 o'clock went it agone with a stormy  
breeze from the W a steering S E by E  
and so ends this Day Lat 42: 24 Long 43: 34

Sunday the 28 of Decemder  
This Day we have a strong breeze from  
the W a steering S E by E the  
weather rather cold with saw thing in  
sight Lat 44: 28 Long

Monday the 29 Decemder  
This Day we have strong breezes from the  
W a steering E by S so ends this Day

Tuesday the 30 we have strong winds from  
the W a steering S half E saw a  
number of findacks later of this Day  
squally and so ends this

Wednesday the 31 of Decemder  
This Day we have strong winds from  
the S and W a steering E half S  
no more this Day Lat 41: 07 Long 65: 37 E

Thursday the first of January  
This Day we have a gale of wind from the W  
steering E half S with dadd reef fore and  
mizen topsails Lat 40: 01 Long 69: 22 E

This is the 2 Day of a new year 1852

Friday the 2 Day of January  
This Day we have a gale of wind from  
the west a steering E until 11  
at night and then kept of E S E for  
Saint Pauls Island Distant 200 and 80  
Miles Lat 39: 17 Long 72: 53 E

Saterday the 3 of January  
This Day commences with a gale of wind from  
the W a steering E S E for  
Saint Pauls Island Distant 50 miles  
At 2 o'clock the weather thick and  
rainy kept of S S E the land 30 miles  
Distant Lat 38: 50 Longitude 76: 30 E

Sunday the 4 of January  
This Day we have a strong breeze from the  
W a steering S E by E the weather  
more moderate and so ends this Day and  
Sunday Lat 39: 33 Long 72: 50 E

Monday the 5 of January 1852  
This Day we have a gale of wind from the  
W and the later part the gale increases  
at 4 o'clock the dadd reef fore and mizen  
topsails and took in the mizen top sail  
and so ends Lat Long

Tuesday the 6 of January  
This Day we have a heavy gale of wind from  
the N and W a steering S S E  
with nothing in sight Lat 40: 23 Long 72: 59

Wednesday the 7 January 1852  
This Day we have it more moderate and the  
wind from the S and W a steering  
S E by E on dent the fly gill and  
mended it and dent it agone so ends this  
Saturday Longitude
