

Transactions on Wednesday the 11th May 1796

Begins with a brisk southerly wind and some small showers of rain at 9 AM got under way & run up as far as Providence at 11 AM. Came along side of the wharf at 3.9 PM, went to the Custom house and visited the Shop at 5.9 PM, undertook to move the Dept at 10 1/2 PM. Got her Along side of the Wharf and made fast

Transactions on Thursday the 12th May 1796

Begins with moderate breeze from the southward and good weather began to dis charge our Coals had it Shoddy. Latter thunder and lightning attended and heavy wind from the NW got out this day 656 Bushels of Coals

Transactions on Friday 13th 1796

Begins light breeze from the southward and flying Clouds at 10 AM the wind from the NW at 1. PM the wind came round to the SW and good weather attended find that our Coals fell short Considerable at 2 1/2 PM got under way and beat down at 6. PM hit both ends on a Point which obliged us to Lay until the tide flowed at 7 1/2 PM got off and dropped in deeper water brought her up with the Small beaded Anchor
