

Journal of a Voyage Kept on board

Thursday Sep the 18
Commences with fresh winds and cloudy
at 12 on bent the fore topmast staysail
at 5 Am set the fore topmast & middle part
more moderate at daylight made all sail
at 12 AM saw a ship standing part way
across our bow

Friday Sep the 19. 1838
Commences with light winds and pleasant
weather at 3 PM saw the Islands Flores and
Cavo ahead at 6 PM hauled out SW with
the wind very light at 8 PM Clewed up the
topgalantails and hauled out the topsails
reef taker with the lands Dist 20 miles
Baring SE at daylight caught a large cod fish
at 8 Am on bent the main topsail to remain
at 12 Am made all sail

Saturday Sep the 20
Commences with light winds and pleasant
weather with all hands employed in
various jobs with the ship standing in for
the land at 3 PM saw a brig laying off and
on at 5 PM saw a ship ahead standing
to the eastward at 6 PM she bore down fore
the island middle part fine breeze at
7 AM spoke the brig *Anteburton* of Bedford
with 110 bbls of oil at 9 AM made the island
of pico and *Foyall* Dist 50 miles and saw
a brig standing on the wind in for the land

Sunday Sep the 21 1838
Commences with fresh winds from the
south we dining down the north side
of the Islands at 6 AM hauled under
the lee of St George and doubled reefed
the topsails at 12 PM hauled the main
yard to the mast at 3 Am wore ship and
goed to the west at daylight made sail
and saw a ship astern at 7 Am were ship
understood to the Southward

the Ship Galen Bount to the East Cape

Monday Sep the 22
Commences with fresh winds and squally
at 4 PM St George Baring SE from whence
I take my Departure for the island of St
Michael at 10 PM hauled aback the main
topsail and layed till 4 AM and then kept
her off SE at daylight made all sail
with a fine breeze at 11 AM saw the land
at 12 AM we were invited below to a sumptuous
repast on Cape and turkeys So ends all in all

Thursday Sep the 25
Commences with light winds and pleasant
weather with the island of St Michael
all in sight at 6 AM hauled in for the land
and took in sail at 8 PM tacked ship and
stood off shore at 2 AM stood in shore
at 4 AM hauled the main yard aback
at daylight made sail and stood in the
bay of St Michael to look for whales so ends
these 24 in the bay

Wednesday Sep the 24
Commences with fine weather at 3 PM the
waist boat came along side from the shore
with Squashes and Apples at 5 PM ran down
across a Portuguese brig and saw a ship
under the lee of the island at 7 o'clock PM
St Michael East part bore west Dist 12 miles
from whence I take my Departure fore the
Cape Lizards at 6 AM set the topmast
studdent sail with a fresh breeze at 6 AM
saw a sale sports off our bow at 10 AM
run her hull down

Thursday Sep the island
Commences with a fine breeze and
with the watch employed on ship
middle part wind rather light
over hauling the cutting gear with
owners had ought to have
there at home if I think right
tacked ship and stood to the
winds there 24 hours with fine wet
a lump Duph with Crocodiles
