 middle part strong winds from the
 South and Eastward and thick water
 Lt 38-28 further put the same at 11
 Lt 74.00 So ends the 26 hrs

 Jan 9 from the South and Eastward at 2
 o'clock

After at 3 o'clock we saw mountains
 at 6 o'clock saw black rocks
 bearing at 8 o'clock
 at 10 o'clock left the fog

Monday the 24 hours commences with the wind
 Jan 13 to the East thick fog mild part to
 1843 long waves sounding from 20 to 15
 fathoms further put the same
 thick fog and wind saw nothing
 so ends the 24 hrs

 Monday the 26 hours commences with the
 December 18 wind from the South at 2 o'clock
 1843 got under way in a fresh breeze
 and went to sea at 12 o'clock
 (Richard) pilot off to the west of
 Cook's Bay to 5 miles so ends the 26 hrs

Tuesday the 26 hours commences with strong wind
 Dec 19 from the North and Westward middle part
 1843 the sand further put gradually and voyaging
 Lt 40-230 So ends the 26 hrs
 Lt 70-25 w

Wednesday the 26 hours commences with strong
 Dec 20 wind from the South and Westward
 middle part squally water
 Lt 39-22 further put the same
 Lt 69.00 w
