Monday Journal of a voyage in the Osceola
at 11 a.m. got under way and went
to sea with wind from the westward
So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
these 24 hours commences with light winds from
the south and eastward and some squalls of
rain middle part light winds from the west
and pleasant latter part the same sea as middle
of small vessels So ends these 24 hours
Lat 40.50 N Long 71.26 W

Wednesday
these 24 hours commences with light winds
from the south and eastward middle part
the same latter part light winds from the
south and westward and pleasant weather
nothing in sight So ends these 24 hours
Lat 39.33 N Long 72.58 W

Thursday
these 24 hours commences with light winds from
the south and pleasant weather leading to the
westward middle part strong winds from
the south and westward latter part the same
sea as ship standing to the south
So ends these 24 hours
Lat 38.47 N Long 74.21 W

Friday
these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the south and westward and several
middle part strong winds from the S.W. with
kedges put to latter part the same nothing
in sight So ends these 24 hours
Lat 37.50 N Long 75.38 W

Saturday
these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the south and westward leading to the
south and east under short sail middle
part strong winds from the south and westward
at 5 a.m. called the steward Stephen Brown and
he went forward and say him no more before he
went over board with by accident or intention
latter part strong winds So ends these 24 hours
Lat 36.38 N Long 76.58 W

Sunday
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the south and westward middle part strong winds from
the westward and several within latter part
the same sea as nothing So ends these 24 hours
Lat 35.02 N Long 78.00 W
