

Journal of a Voyage on Board the
Sunday June 18th

At 10 AM the pilot came on board
got under way in rain island. Stannard
and stood out through the reef
with light winds from the N.W.
So ends this day to begin the Sea Day

Monday June 19th

At 1 PM Discharged the pilot and
steered of S.W. at 6 PM block
Island bore S.W. & Dist 5 miles from
which I take my Departure Middle and
latter parts light winds from the
S.W. all hands employed in fitting
the boats and other necessary work
So ends this day Lat 40° 27' N

Tuesday June 20th

These 24 hours commences with light airs
and calm several sails in sight
lowered for a sword fish but did not
get any saw hump back Whales several
times lowered two boats for them but
did not get fast latter part calm
Menn employed in ship's duties
Lat 40° 21' N Lon 69° 45' West

Wednesday June 21st

First and middle parts calm latter
parts light airs from the South saw
a number of hump backs at 11 AM
lowered for a school of black fish
got fast to one and hauled so ends
steering S.W. by S & E

Thursday June 22nd

All these 24 hours pleasant breeze from
S.W. steering S.W. one sail in sight
steering S.W. So ends this day
Nothing in sight
