Sunday September the 15<sup>th</sup> 1850  
Commences with moderate breezes from the S. steering E.S.E. at 5 P.M. the wind hauled to the N.E. middle part light breezes from the S. with rain. latter part variable winds with rainy weather.

Monday the 16<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S. steering E.S.E. with rainy weather, and calms middle part fresh gales from the E.N.E. heading S.E. took in the topgallant sails furlled the fore and mizen topsails. latter part moderate set the fore and mizen topsails double reefed. fitted the cutting blocks. one sail in sight.

Tuesday the 17<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh gales from the E.N.E. heading S.E. middle and latter parts strong breezes from the E.S.E. heading N.E. shook the reefes out of the topsails set the jib and mainsail. sent the cutting pennants aloft.

Wednesday the 18<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong breezes from the E.S.E. heading N.E. at 4 P.M. double reefed the topsails furlled the jib and mainsail. with rainy weather middle part squally furlled the fore and mizen topsails and fore sail. latter part the wind hauled S.W. set the topsail jib and mainsail. the watches employed in ships duties.

Thursday the 19<sup>th</sup> of September 1850  
Commences with strong breezes from the S. steering E by S at 7 P.M. double reefed the topsail middle part furlled the jib and mainsail. latter part fresh breezes from the S. turned the reefes out of the topsails set the jib and mainsail. steering E by S.

Friday the 20<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh breezes from the S. steering E by S. with pleasant weather middle and latter parts fine breezes from the S.E. made all sail. Broke out the after hold.

Commences with light breezes from the S. steering E by S with fine weather. lowered the boats to practice middle and latter parts light airs and calms employed in ships duties. saw a school of Grampusos.
