Tuesday June 7th 1822 Remarks on
At 11 AM took our anchor at Palermo Solina
Ona stood for sea with a small breeze from the North

Wednesday June the 8th

Commenced with a small breeze from the south heading
Lat 40.36 To the westward at 2 PM the pilot left by head
GC distant 14 Miles at 7 PM tacked to the SE east
Long 71.25 End of Black Island bearing SW by S distant 10 Miles
Middle Cabin Letter Strong breeze from the East

Thursday June the 9th

Strong breeze from the East heading to the South
At 11 AM took the top sail hauled the 9th
Lat 40.00 Ona In sail at 12 AM tacked to the SE at 3 PM
tacked to the South Wind GC and rain falling in
Long 70.30 Torrents Letter at 5 AM tacked to the SE at 11 AM
took a squall from SW by W all hands
and closed reefed the top sail Ona hauled the Main
Sail so ends this day

Friday June the 10th

Lat 39.30 First fast fresh breeze from the SW attenuated with
Rain and fog heading SE Middle the same
Long 69.50 Latter Course GC Wind SW saw Black Island and pursued
At 10 AM set the Main sail so ends this day

Saturday June the 11th

First fast Strong Strong breeze from SW and a rugged
Lat 39.06 Course GC Middle Course Course GC by 9 hauled up the
Main sail and fore sail at 1 PM hauled the Main sail
Long 67.56 Latter Got the foresail and Main the Mast heads at 10 AM
Got the Main top gallant sail over a single reefed top sail
Charles & Russell a boat steered which hauled itself aloft

Sunday June the 12th

Lat 37.33 First fast strong winds from the West Course GC Middle
The same Latter Got the Main top gallant sail over a single
Long 65.48 top sail so ends this day
