Remarks On Board Tuesday June 19th - ^{see account} 1838

Commences with a fresh Breeze from the Eastward with pleasant
Weather At 9 A.M got under way & ran out of Buzzards Bay
for Sea At 12 A.M discharged the Pilot & stood out to the Southward &
Westward To End these 24 hours All hands Employed

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 20th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with fresh Breezes
from the East with pleasant weather at 2 P.M Let the Ship Come
on the Wind at 6 P.M. homans Land bore E. S. E. distant 17 miles
of which itake may be past at 6 P.M took in the Topgallant Sails
Ship Standing South on the Wind while part Light Breezes
from the E. S. E. & Pleasant weather Latter part Light
Breezes intermixed with Calm Winds from the E. S. E. Ship
heading to the South at 6 A.M Let the Topgallant Sails
To End these 24 hours All hands Employed in Ships Duty

Remarks On Board Thursday June 21th 1838

First Part of these 24 Hours Commences with Light Breezes
from the South Ship heading E. S. E. under all sail
At 8 P.M. spoke a Schooner bound to New York did not
learn her name Middle Part Gentle Breezes and foggy weather
Latter part Light winds and Pleasant weather At 10 A.M the Ship Cast
Winds from the South at 9 A.M. Lower the Starboard Boat to
Catch a Todjick did not get fast To End these 24 hours
all hands Employed in Ships Duty
