

Ship Brant from New Bedford Bound towards the Western Islands June 22nd

Remarks - On Board ^{Friday} June 22nd 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with light winds & pleasant weather Steering the Ship Eastward from the South at 2 P.M. Spoke the Ship Baltimore of New York from harbor bound to New York at 4 P.M. Spoke an English Brig from Demarora bound to Yarmouth Middle Part Gentle Breezes Steering the Ship East half South at 9 A.M. Saw a School of Black fish loved the Boat Larboard Boat fastened to two of them & dived from them at 11 A.M. Lard, Starboard & Waste boats fastened held the Black fish & hoisted them on board the Ship Later Part Gentle Breezes from S.W. Steering East half South So ends these 24 hours Lat by Obs 40.00 Long by Obs 73.38 W

Remarks On Board Saturday June 23rd 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh breeze from S.W. Steering East half South at 3 P.M. Saw several specks on the Weather glass which shew for them to not see them again at 4 P.M. Tackled Ship to eastward Latter Part Light Breezes from the West Steering the Ship East by S. So ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

Remarks On Board Sunday June 24th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with light airs & Calms with pleasant weather Commenced Boiling out our Black fish Blubber at 7 P.M. Saw a School of Black fish loved the Boat Larboard boat fastened to two & dived from them, Waste Boat fastened to one and saved it brought it along side of the Ship & hoisted on board Middle Part Light winds from the S.E. Ship standing on the wire to the N.E. Latter Part Gentle Breezes from the S.W. Steering Ship East half South at 10 A.M. Set the fore topmast standing Sail So ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty.

Remarks On Board Monday June 25th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Breeze from the S.W. Steering the Ship East by S half South Middle Part Strong Breezes from S.W. at 6 A.M. took in the fore & Mizzen top Gallant sails at 9 A.M. set the topmast Sails Latter Part fresh Breezes from the Westward and squally with showers of rain Steering the Ship East by S. So ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

Long by Obs 69.25 W

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 26th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Strong Breezes from the S.W. Steering Ship East by S. Middle Part fresh Breezes and squally with heavy Showers of rain Latter Part the same Steering the Ship East So ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 27th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with fresh Breezes from the S.W. and squally with heavy Showers of rain Steering the Ship East Middle & later Parts the same with heavy Showers of rain and foggy Steering the Ship East by South So ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty with No Observation.
