Remarks On Board Friday January 18th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Breeze from the NW by N, with thick foggy weather Steaming the Ship S by E under all Sail, Middle & Latten Parts Gentle Gale from the North with thick and foggy with Showers of rain Steaming the Ship S by E under the Top Sails & Booms So Ends these 24 hours,

Remarks On Board Saturday January 19th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Gale from the North with thick foggy weather, Ship sailing S by E, Middle Part Gentle Breeze and Pleasant weather Latter Part Fresh Breeze from the North with Squalls of rain Steaming the Ship S by E under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 43.44 N
Long in by Obs 13.27 West

Remarks On Board Sunday January 20th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Gale from the North with squalls of rain, at 4 PM under the fore Top Sail, and Bent the Main one, Steaming Ship S by E, Middle Part Gentle Breeze and equally Latter Part Fresh Breeze from the NW and Pleasant weather Steaming the Ship S by East under all Sail, So Ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 47.56 N
Long in by Obs 17.30 E

Remarks On Board Monday January 21st 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Breeze from the NW & Squalls Steaming the Ship S by E under all Sail; Middle & Latten Parts Gentle Gale from the West & Squalls with a heavy sea running Steaming the Ship S by East under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 44.15 South
Long in by Obs 22.16 East

Remarks On Board Tuesday January 22nd 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Gale from the West with a heavy sea running Steaming to the East under all Sail, Middle Part Gentle Breeze & foggy, Latter Part Gentle Breeze from the NW with Pleasant weather Steaming the Ship S by East under all Sail, So Ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 44.49 N
Long in by Obs 26.31 E

Remarks On Board Wednesday January 23rd 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breeze from the NW with Pleasant weather Steaming the Ship S by East Middle Part Gentle Breeze and Pleasant weather, Latter Part light Wind from the West and Pleasant weather Steaming the Ship S by East under all Sail, So Ends these 24 hours,

No Obs this Day,
