

Ship Board of New Bedford in the
Remarks on Board Wednesday January 30th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with light Winds from the N.W. Ship heading to the W.W. under short Sail, Middle Part light Winds & variable intermixed with Barons & foggy at 9 AM made all Sail on the Ship Latter Part light Winds from the East intermixed with fog Ship heading to the S.W. So ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 44° 08' S
Long in by Obs 42° 40' W

Remarks on Board Thursday January 31st 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breezes from the East & foggy Ship heading to the S.W. under all sail at 6 AM took in sail and let the Ship by two under short sail Middle Part Fresh Breezes from the N.W. and foggy at 6 AM set Double reef Fore & Main Top Sails on the Ship steered S.W. at 10 AM wind freshened on to a Gale took in the Fore Top Sail & Fore Sail let the Ship come to on the wind heading to the S.W. Latter Part Fresh Gale and equally Ship lying to under a Plot reef Main Top Sail & Spencers So ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 45° 03' S
Long in by Obs 44° 02' West

Remarks on Board Friday February 1st 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Gale from the West Ship lying to under short Sail heading to the S.W. Middle Part more moderate at 8 AM made all sail on the Ship, Latter Part light Winds from the N.W. with Pleasant Weather Ship heading to the East under all Sail, So ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 45° 38' South
Long in by Obs 45° 00' West

Remarks on Board Saturday February 2^d 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breezes from the North with Pleasant weather Steering the Ship South under all Sails at 1 PM unhooked the Fore Sail & bent another one in its Place, at 4 PM took in sail & Steered the Ship South under short Sail Middle Part Gentle Breezes at 5 AM made all Sail on the Ship at 10 AM Wind freshened on to a Gale took in Sail & let Ship by two under short Sail heading to the N.W. Latter Part Fresh Gale from the N.W. with thick foggy & showers of rain So ends these 24 hours,

Remarks on Board Sunday February 3^d 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Gale from the N.W. Ship heading on a Wind to N.W. under short Sail Middle & Latter Parts Fresh Gale from the North with thick foggy weather with showers of rain Ship heading to the W.W. under a Plot reef Main Top Sail & spencers, So ends these 24 hours,

No Obs this Day,

Remarks on Board Monday February 4th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the N.W. with a heavy sea running at 2 PM the fog cleared up made sail on the Ship steered to the N.E. at 4 PM took in sail, and let the Ship head to the S.W. under short Sails, Middle Part light Winds and Pleasant weather at 5 AM made all Sail on the Ship & cleared last run several finbacks Latter Part Fresh Breezes from the W.W. with Pleasant weather Steering the Ship East So ends these 24 hours,
