

On board of the Barque Brighton
 Tuesday June the 3th 1855

This day comes in with pleasant weather
 and fresh breeze from the N.W. at 6 am
 got the barque under weigh and stood out
 of the bay about 10 the Capt got on board
 at 11 wind N.W. imployed in working
 ship out of the bay the pilot left us
 about 2 P.M. at 3 P.M. Mennars land bore
 N.E. per compass Dist 5 miles. at 7 had the
 anchor stowed & chains below all the part
 the bowsprit strands on this continues
 ship steering to the S.E.

Wednesday June 4th

The fore part fine ship
 under easy sail. At 11 am at day light
 set to galeant sails saw a sho of sail
 heading to the E. ward. All hands imployed
 in boats & various other jobs
 this day

Capt. Tucker. Outward bound
 Wednesday June 20th 1855

Remarks
 These 24 hours comes in with
 light winds from the E. ward and
 being fine heading to the E. ward
 4th sailing ship under easy sail
 heading to the E. ward wind from
 the E. ward. saw a pinack people
 imployed variously pumping ship
 170 strokes per 24 hours. Thus ends
 Lat 40. 10 N
 Long 44. 20 W

Remarks Thursday June 21st

This day comes in with fair
 weather and light breeze from the E.
 ward ship heading E. ward saw pinack
 & a new ship to the E. ward 3 am
 rain a fair with light breeze
 people imployed variously so ends
 five men below sick two with
 fever

Remarks Friday June 22nd

Comes in fair and calm
 all hands imployed in various duties
 at 4 rain wind S.W. at 5 sheltered
 sail with thick & foggy weather with
 some rain people variously imployed
 turned the reef out of the S. sails &
 set no S. sail this ends this day
 with pumping ship 160 strokes
