to the westward; employed in breaking ^{out} the
after hatchway so end

Thursday 14 these 24 hours commenced with light breezes
from the Southward at 3 A.M. tacked to
the Eastward; saw one sail & porpoises
the new sailors getting better; things look
fair & prosperous Sat 3708

Friday 15 these 24 hours strong gales from the South
and heavy squalls with torrents of rain
latter part double reefed the topsails
the wind the same Ship heading WSW
watch employed in making Boat sails

Song 72 34

Saturday 16 strong breezes from the Southward & squally
course SE by S; in the evening heavy tempest
and sharp lightning and torrent of rain;
Ship in the Gulf Stream; a bad sea struck
the Ship which hove her over & rolled
the sea boats nearly all under & parted
their grips; at A.M. saw a few Black Fish
not worth lowering for blowing as it then
did so end these 24 hours

Sat by obs 37 41

Cruising in the Atlantic Ocean for Spinn Whales 1842
Sunday July 17 1842
commenced with strong breezes from the from SW by S
Barge heading to the SE; at sunset shortened
sail; a bad sea running from the Southward;
at day light made sail; at 2:30 2 sails in sight
from the mast head; latter part fine weather
, how delightful it would be to hear the word
of the Lord preached to day!

Let the sweet hope that thou art in me
My life and death attend,
Thy presence through my journey shine,
And crown my journey's end,

Sat in to day 36 52 N

Monday 18 commences with strong breezes from WSW
course SE at night shortened sail; at 2 A.M.
sat the fore topsail & commenced felling the
cutting gear; latter part frequent squalls
of rain & little wind; saw one shoal of Killers
and Black Fish did not lower the Boats after
them so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday 19

commenced with strong breezes & heavy rain
squalls; wind from the SW courses SE by S
& by S the watch on deck varriously employed
saw nothing of the fish kind worth noticing
so ends these these 24 hours
