W. at daylight made sail the last part light breezes from the S. W. at 6 P. M. stood of to the N. saw grampuses employed reefing C flushing Mast. C pushing up upon gunn 20 miles cut down the S. side off jagab bore E. S. E.

Remarks On Board. Wednesday August 9<sup>th</sup>

The first part of these twenty four hours light breezes from the W. A cruising the captain C his son John on board the gay head saw grampuses 2 sails in sight the middle part commences with an inclining breezes from the N. E. hounding to the N. at 6 A. M. sent A boat on board the gay head at 7 the boat returned with the captain C his son in it stood to the S. cut to A. M. wind N. E. took in sail at sunrise fresh breeze C equally from N. E. with light rain set double reef C stood to the N. the last part fresh breezes from the N. E. at 6 A. M. were to the E. saw grampuses at 11 turned the reefs out the foreails employed climbing coal tar on the boat jagab bearing by compass set down C by N piece bearing E 20 miles
