On board Ship Cadmus of Fairhaven 41

1st Remarks on Thursday October 14th 1834

at 6 A.M. got under way from New Bedford harbour
& stood to sea wind at north at 8 A.M. pilot left us
with 24 souls on board William Crowell master
Edwin I. Mayhew mate, Inneswick A. May 2^d
mate & Anthony Gasent 3^d mate

2nd Remarks on board Friday Oct 17th 1834

First part of the day light winds & cloudy weather at
5 P.M. saw land (Island) bore E by S distance 15 miles
from which I take my departure
latter part of the day strong winds under all
ordinary sail standing E S E under way weather watch
employed in ships duty so ends this day Lat 40° 41' N
Long 69° 50' W

3rd Remarks on board Saturday Oct 18th 1834

First part of the 24 hours strong breeze from south
steering E S E under all necessary sail under way weather
watch employed in ships duty
latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds
watch employed in ships duty saw two ships standing
to the NNE so ends this day Lat 40° 07' N
Long 69° 50' W

4th Remarks on board Sunday Oct 19th 1834

First part fine breeze & passing clouds watch employed
in fitting craft & boat wind to the S W middle & latter
part of the day strong winds & passing clouds at 8 A.M.
sailed topgallant sails & reefed topsails so ends this
24 hours Lat 40° 16' N
Long 62° 25' W
