

Friday Aug 24 1872

Lat 40.46 First part of this day moderate breeze
Long 40.34 Middle part the same Latter part
calms Saw three sails Broke out water
and performed ships duty lowered the
boats for exercise and so ends.

Saturday Aug 25

Lat 41.16 First part of this day light breeze
Long 40.33 ship heading E Middle part the same
Latter part good breeze from S by S ship
heading E. Saw three sails exchanged
signals with an English bark Employed
in setting up and taring the rigging
and various other jobs and so ends.

Sunday Aug 26

Lat 41.38 First part of this day good breeze from
Long 38.58 the S by S ship on the starboard tack
heading E by S Middle part the same
Latter part light breeze saw two sails
steering to the westward and so ends.

Monday Aug 27

Lat 41.35 First part strong breeze from NE by S
Long ship steering ENE under whole top sails
and courses Middle part the same
Latter part blowing on saw three sails
steering to the westward. Employed in
ships duty. fixed a new grind stone.

Tuesday Aug 28

Lat 41.23 First part strong breeze from the NE
Long 38.18 with rain Middle part the same
Latter part moderate saw one sail
ship heading ESE and so ends.

Wednesday Aug 29 1872

Lat 40.38 First part of this day light breeze from the
Long 30.27 W ship heading S by E Middle and Latter
parts the same saw one sail Employed in
ship duty and so ends. at sun down took
in sail.

Thursday Aug 30

Lat 39.06 First part of this day light breeze
Long 28.13 from the NW Middle part the same
Latter part steering S by W Saw a school
of grampus and one sail. Employed in
setting up the head gear. Broke out water
and butter cut three new jibs and so ends.

Friday Aug 31

First part of this day light breeze Middle
and Latter parts the same about 7 A.M.
saw the islands of Pico and Fayal Saw
several schools of grampus and two sails
at sun down took in sail ship becalmed
off the passage between the two island.

Saturday Sept 1

First part of this day light air and
calms Middle and Latter parts the
same ship off the passage between the
two islands saw one school of grampus
land distance 12 miles Employed in
the rigging and so ends.

Sunday September 2

First part of this day moderate
breeze and fog with rain Middle
part squally and rain Latter part
blowing a gale took in sail to close
reef I main top sail the island of
Terceira in sight distance 10 miles at
sun down and so ends.
