Thursday Mar 22<sup>nd</sup> 1888

Strong breeze from the E.S.C. ship steering N by W. weather thick nothing in sight.

Friday Mar 23<sup>rd</sup>

This day strong breeze from the E.S.C. at day light raised a lone sperm whale astern ship lowered three boats and the starboard boat struck. struck the whale the first rising, got it along side about 1. P.M. got dinner and got ready to cut, took in some of the body and let it lay for the night - weather very rugged Sunday Island about ten miles off bearing N.W. of us, weather quite thick

Saturday Mar 24<sup>th</sup>

This day good weather wind light from the E.S.C. at day light commenced to cut. got through about dark bailed the case overboard, nothing in sight except birds.

Sunday Mar 25<sup>th</sup>

This day strong breeze from the E ship stood on opposite tacks, went close to Sunday island saw small juppers and porpoises. employed boiling.

Monday Mar 26<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day strong breeze from the E. with very heavy rain middle and latter parts moderating and stopped raining. cleared away some and saw Goat island bearing W.S.W. distance 15 miles off. employed boiling. saw fish.

off on the wind to the S.E. weather squally

Tuesday Mar 27<sup>th</sup> 1888

Light breeze from the S.W. ship steering for Sunday island bearing N.W. from us to night distance 15 miles off. ship luffed on the wind heading W.N.W. finished boiling this morning whale turned up 107 lbs. broke out bread, beans, sugar ten tins of butter, four bags of flour, corn also broke out a box of soap.

Wednesday Mar 28<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from the W.S.W. ship on the wind working to the S. saw Sunday Isle this morning bearing N.W. some distance off. employed stowing down oil. saw fish Goat island on our weather beam to night

Thursday Mar 29<sup>th</sup>

Blowing strong from the S.W. by S. with very heavy swell. raised Sunday island this morning on the lee bow made sail and passed it. moderating to night.

Friday Mar 30<sup>th</sup>

Light breezes from the S.E. run in off Sunday island and sent two boats ashore Mr Kingo and Mr Taber. Mr Taber returned got on board about half past seven, with two bags of potatoes, two bunches of bananas. Mr Kingo remained ashore.

Saturday Mar 31<sup>st</sup>

Good breeze from E.S.C. ship laying on and off Sunday island Capt. went ashore and returned also Mr Kingo, with bananas 11 sheep pumpkins, potatoes, melons &c kept
