The first part of the day a goodly
fair breeze - the latter part a stronger breeze from
the S. West - merchantman steamers & galleons -
to night with main to gamsail out steering N. N. East -
Long of the brig 41.30 - steering to the N.

Friday June 10th 1881

Another day with east & gen of the sun gen
blewing clean in the far west - it left us in the remaining part -
a heavy gale of increased until about 10. A m lay in the first part
from the on the port tack, were sound & click this morning & laying
Southward, the remaining part on the Star - tack to night N. N. West
with only main spencers out -

Saturday June 11th 1881

the first part of these 24 hours blowing quite
fair weather - we set the main topsail about 12 P.M. - this
morning were sound & steered N. by East - with a
strong breeze - to night under courses & low topsails
Heading N. by E. & East & repaired the damages we got

Sunday June 12th 1881

there 24 hours we had had - the first part
quite moderate weather - the latter part blowing a strong
breeze from the N. West - there has not a thing in sight
in the shape of a whale - under low topsails & courses heading
N. by E. & E. to the northward - may we get a whale before long

Monday June 13th 1881

the first part of these 24 hours moderate wind
with a heavy sea running - the latter part quite moderate &
fair weather for this place - a few birds porpoises & galleons
is all that has in seen morning - steering N. by E. & East -
Lat 55. 07

Tuesday June 14th 1881

the first part of these 24 hours day moderate
through the first part of the day, squally with strong breezes
to night steering N. - nothing in seen through the day

Wednesday June 15th 1881

the first part of the day moderate with
gentle breeze - the latter part it had breezed up & came in thick
& smoky - there has not a thing in seen - Lat 57. 35 Long 41. 10

July 4 light
breeze -

the first part of the day July & smoky - the latter
from the part moderate & fair weather for this place - there has not
Eastward a single thing in seen morning - cruising by the wind
Lat. 57. 34 Long 41. 25

Friday June 17th 1881

the first part of the day moderate breeze
with fog - the latter part also - there has not a thing
in seen morning - steering by the wind in to the N. East

Saturday June 18th 1881

the first part of the day calm & N. N. East with
a light breeze - the latter part the wind has left us in a
calm - land raised at one P.M. galleons is all
heading S. E. land on the Port quarter - Greenland
Lat 59. 15 Long

Sunday June 19th 1881

the first part of the day fair weather with
a moderate breeze - the latter part smoky & a fresh
breeze from the East & East - the day square had examined
the wind & one seal & quite a number of birds in sight -

Monday June 20th 1881

the first part of the day light breezes & smoky
the latter part light breezes & quite good seeing, then 41 as
only birds in seen - there has not a whale around seen -

Tuesday June 21th 1881

the first part calm & smoky - the
latter part a moderate breeze steering East - cloudy &
smoke seen - there has not a thing in sight through
the day - may we get some oil before long -

Wednesday June 22th 1881

the first part of the day day moderate
weather - the latter part it has breezed up - there has
not any thing in seen through the day - smoky

Thursday June 23th 1881

the first part of the day a strong
breeze - the latter part it has breezed up to quite a
fresh gale from the E. N. East - there has one sulphur bottom
in seen - by the wind under low main topsail N. N. East
